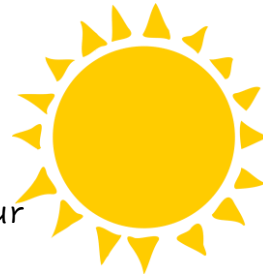

- Begin to understand the need to respect and care for the natural environment and all living things.



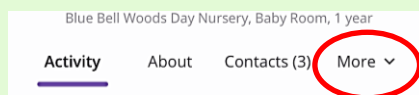

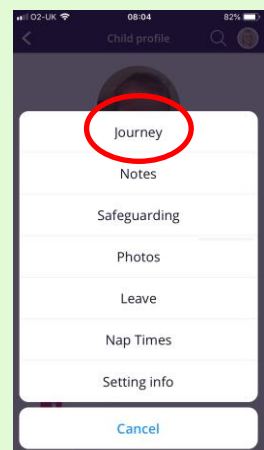
Summer Term Progress Summary
