Illness policy and procedures:

At this time of year, lots of children suffer from minor coughs and colds. If your child is well in themself and able to take part in the nursery routine, then they may come to nursery.

You must let us know if you gave your child infant paracetemol (e.g. Calpol) before they came to nursery.

If your child has a temperature of over **38C** they should **NOT** come to nursery. Likewise, if your child spikes a temperature at nursery we will call to ask that your child be collected.

Please ensure your contact details are up to date and you are contactable should your child become unwell and need collecting.

Antibiotics-

We can administer antibiotics at nursery, if your child has been given their first dose at home and monitored carefully to ensure no reactions take place.

If your child has an infectious illness or communicable disease, they should NOT come to nursery. This includes:

- Sickness/ diarrhoea may return 48 hours after the last episode.
- · Scarlet Fever- may return after 24hrs of antibiotic treatment
- Chicken pox may return five days from onset of rash and when all the lesions have crusted over.
- Impetigo may return when all lesions are crusted /healed

Please let us know if your child will not be in nursery for any reason- you can use the famly app, email us or ring us.
