Our Educational Programme

Mark-making isn't just about learning to write our names... it takes place in many forms and all ages take part!

Physical development

0-3 years: Develop manipulation and control. Explore different materials and tools.

3-4 years: Use large muscle movements to wave flags and streamers, paint and make marks.

Literacy

0-3 years: Add some marks to their drawings, which they give meaning to. For example: "That says mummy."

Expressive arts and design

3-4 years: Use some of their print and letter knowledge in their early writing.

0-3 years: Start to make marks intentionally. Explore different materials, using all their senses to investigate them. Manipulate and play with different materials.

3-4 years: Draw with increasing complexity and detail.
