


We stay safe in nursery

We teach children how to behave in a way that keeps themselves and others safe.


EXPECTATIONS

We support children to follow our behaviour EXPECTATIONS; we encourage children to meet these expectations as they grow and mature, in preparation for school.













Support your child to do 'good listening' at home.

Try saying your child's name first to gain their attention and speak to them at eye level.

Give short, simple instructions and praise your child's 'good listening'!




Encourage 'good sitting' at home.

At nursery, we always sit and eat at the table together. Encourage your child to do 'good sitting' at mealtimes, and when having a drink or snack.

We encourage children to sit for increasing lengths of time for stories, circle time and activities as they progress through the nursery. You can share books, chat and sing with your child to develop listening and attention skills at home.


